SEEDLING INFORMATION

All species are BARE-ROOT STOCK . The rate of growth of your trees and shrubs will vary depending on many factors. Average size of stock may vary.
SEEDLINGS - A seedling has been grown entirely in its original seedbed. Seedlings are economical, easy to plant and handle, and a favorite for large scale plantings.
(TP) TRANSPLANTS - Transplants are seedlings that have been removed from their original seedbed and transplanted to a new seedbed. Compared to a seedling, transplants have a superior root system. Branching is noticeable and the main stem is significantly more solid. Although transplants have not yet developed a "mature" tree shape, they are superior in appearance compared to a seedling. Transplants are especially appealing to those landowners where a small quantity of trees is needed and appearance is a major consideration.
