SEEDLING INFORMATION

All species are **BARE-ROOT STOCK**. The rate of growth of your trees and shrubs will vary depending on many factors. Average size of stock may vary.

ALL TREES AND SHRUBS SOLD ARE TO BE USED FOR CONSERVATION PURPOSES ONLY.

SEEDLINGS - A seedling has been grown entirely in its original seedbed. Seedlings are economical, easy to plant and handle, and a favorite for large scale plantings.

(TP) TRANSPLANTS - Transplants are seedlings that have been removed from their original seedbed and transplanted to a new seedbed. Compared to a seedling, transplants have a superior root system. Branching is noticable and the main stem is significantly more solid. Although transplants have not yet developed a "mature" tree shape, they are superior in appearance compared to a seedling. Transplants are especially appealing to those landowners where a small quantity of trees is needed and appearance is a major consideration.
