3	REFUNDS WILL NOT BE MADE - *Exception* SWCD will refund money for plants that become unexpectedly unavailable, if substitutions cannot be made. NO REFUNDS will be given for ORDERS NOT PICKED UP .

5	CORTLAND COUNTY SWCD WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE for seedlings once they are removed from the distribution area and will not be responsible for the success or failure of your plantings.
6	CORTLAND COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS are located between Route 281 and Route 11 just north of the Cortland City limits. Follow signs for the JM McDonald Sports Complex which is located adjacent to the fairgrounds.
7	ALL TREES AND SHRUBS SOLD ARE TO BE USED FOR CONSERVATION PURPOSES ONLY. Seedlings may not be planted for ornamental purposes only. Once planted they may not be removed with roots attached. Seedlings are packaged and sold in units of 10. A 5% discount will be applied to purchases of over 100 of one species. Species cannot be combined to reach discount level.

All species are BARE-ROOT STOCK. The rate of growth of your trees and shrubs will vary depending on many factors. Average size of stock may vary.

SEEDLINGS - A seedling has been grown entirely in its original seedbed. Seedlings are economical, easy to plant and handle, and a favorite for large scale plantings.

(TP) TRANSPLANTS - Transplants are seedlings that have been removed from their original seedbed and transplanted to a new seedbed. Compared to a seedling, transplants have a superior root system. Branching is noticeable and the main stem is significantly more solid. Although transplants have not yet developed a "mature" tree shape, they are superior in appearance compared to a seedling. Transplants are especially appealing to those landowners where a small quantity of trees is needed and appearance is a major consideration.
