It is the first and only dairy farm in Cortland County that bottles milk straight from the cow right on the premises. Trinity Valley cream line milk and cheese curds can be found in stores locally, as far south as North Carolina, and as east as Boston.

#### ~ Hillary Hunter, Hunter & Hilsberg

Hunter & Hilsberg is a producer of simple-ingredient fruit jellies and preserves based in Scott. Since 1995, they have sourced fruit from here in the Finger Lakes, across New York State, New England, the east coast, and has expanded to growers on the west coast. As long-time supporters of family farms and small businesses, Hunter & Hilsberg sources directly from farms and regional distributors, allowing them to sell their fruit spreads online, all Wegmans stores, some Williams-Sonoma outlets, Market 32, Price Chopper, Walmart, and more.

Hollenbeck's Cider Mill has been family owned and operated since 1933. Their Virgil store is famous for cider, freshly baked pies, homemade donuts, scratch-baked goods, and other locally produced and sourced grocery items. As a seasonal business, Hollenbeck's is a quintessential fall destination where customers can pick out fresh New York apples and watch the cider press in action, while their winter hours allow folks to grab fresh cider, baked goods, cheese, and other local items.
